Dear City Council and Staff,

Thank you for your extraordinary responsiveness to the Griggs-Scheffer Project concerns of the Edgumbe Place neighborhood. Keeping the existing road path will preserve much of the neighborhood atmosphere where we walk and ride frequently.

Please complete the work by ensuring that the surrounding natural assets, including dozens of mature healthy trees, remain undisturbed. We are writing to urge you to **do three things**:

- Keep the entrance to Edgumbe Place from Edgumbe road at its current width. The video (See <https://bit.ly/3o3bofc>) shows that public safety access is ample. The current width prevents excessive speeds at the intersection and on our road. This sizing will also save the city tens of thousands of dollars in tree removal costs and road materials
- Use curbs on the cul de sac only where water is a problem and use curbs that are sized for the street and grade. This too will save the city tens of thousands of dollars in materials and labor.
- Use road building equipment that is 'right sized' for our small road and cul de sac. This will prevent collateral damage to mature healthy trees.
